Three years ago, St. Joseph Hospital embarked on a new, five-year strategic journey:

- To provide perfect care to our patients.

As we continue to provide care to our “dear neighbor,” St. Joseph Hospital has identified the following needs as our highest priorities to support our mission.

ST. JOSEPH HOSPITAL ANNO

1 Hybrid Operating Room

Leading the way to a new level of cardiac care in Orange County, St. Joseph Hospital introduces its Hybrid Operating Room. Scheduled to open in spring, 2010, the Hybrid OR will allow diagnostic, interventional medicine, therapeutics and surgical cardiovascular services to reside in a contiguous space.

The benefits of a Hybrid Operating Room to patients and their families are immense and immediate. And according to Richard Gates, M.D., medical director of Cardiothoracic Surgery, “the implications are nothing short of life-altering for patients who were previously not considered candidates for valve replacement surgery, but are now likely to be eligible with Hybrid surgical techniques.”

This is genuine patient-centered care. Patients with complex vascular disease will benefit immensely. D. Preston Flanigan, M.D. co-medical

director of Vascular Services and Clinical Outcomes says, “When we complete a complex surgical procedure, we will have the sophisticated imaging equipment there to make sure grafts are in place and blood is flowing properly and make any necessary changes on the spot.”

The Hybrid OR, which will be the first in Orange County, will provide a new level of cardiac care and foster a new tradition of collaboration and innovation. The Hybrid OR will also extend the superior cardiovascular services upon which St. Joseph Hospital has built its reputation.

UNCES NEW PRIORITIES

Design for Perfect Care

Entering a hospital emergency department (ED) and being asked under extreme distress or illness what medications you take, what you're allergic to and who your physicians are can be a stressful experience. Often patients forget an important piece of information, which can impact the care decisions made in the ED. Design for Perfect Care is St. Joseph Hospital's effort to create secure, timely access to medical information through an expanded and more robust electronic medical record system (EMR). The Design for Perfect Care electronic record system will be a vital tool for physicians and nurses, helping them to improve patient care. This system will include online documentation, physician order entry and enhanced patient record security, creating different levels of accessibility as required for patient care. Medical staff can feel more confident in their decision-making, knowing it is based

on timely, accurate and unduplicated data.

Currently 60% of patients are admitted through the ED. Records of patients entering the hospital through the Emergency Department will be available for proper follow-up care. Repeat patients, including those with chronic conditions, will benefit by having their records available electronically in the Emergency Department for immediate decision-making. Time will be saved, accuracy will be improved and data will be available to enhance quality and monitor risks.

The potential quality improvement, security and cost savings of EMRs are considered to be so great and so real, that implementation of these systems is a cornerstone of all current health reform efforts. This critically needed technology upgrade represents a quantum leap into the future of medical innovation that we have come to expect as part of the St. Joseph Hospital tradition. ▼





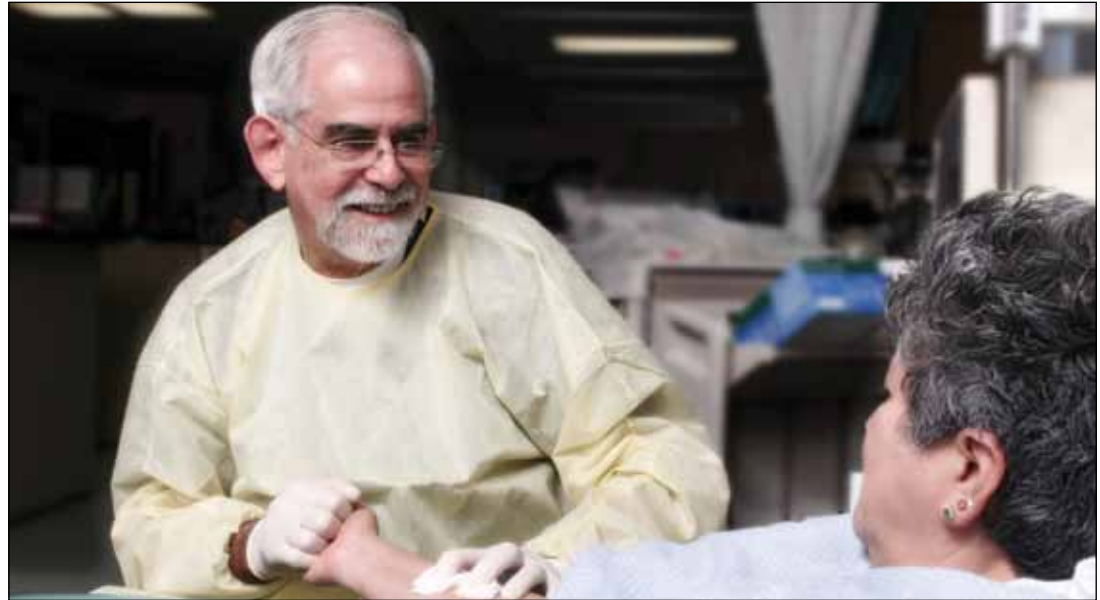

Building on a Tradition of Compassionate Care for Kidney Dialysis Patients

The St. Joseph Hospital Dialysis Center has identified an area where community contributions are needed to help current and future kidney disease patients: Val's Fund for special patient emergency needs.

Val's Fund is a special patient assistance program used to help uninsured or under-insured patients, particularly for the costs of life-saving drug therapies and reliable transportation. This special assistance program improves patient care, quality of life, and, most importantly, positive outcomes by ensuring that patients can get to their treatments, can pay for their critical medications and can meet their daily living needs.

Patients with chronic renal disease have a tremendous financial burden in covering the cost of their care. Dialysis patients may need help with prescription co-pays, transportation, medical devices and other costs. Often, medical insurance does not provide all key functions of dialysis and/or transplant care, which causes great hardship and suffering for these patients. Currently, the fund is helping several patients, yet there is an ongoing need to provide more support for our most vulnerable patients.



“Sara” is a 16 year old girl who has been on hemodialysis for two years and comes to dialysis four times per week (St. Joseph Hospital has the only pediatric dialysis program in the county). Her family has experienced severe financial problems, and no longer has a car available to bring her here. Sara must rely on public transportation. Though the cost of this transportation is relatively modest, given the family's financial situation, it became prohibitive on an ongoing basis. Val's Fund has made it possible for the Dialysis Center to purchase OCTA coupons to ensure Sara's transportation to her life-saving dialysis treatments.

In 2008 more than 33,000 adult and 3,000 pediatric dialysis treatments were performed at the St. Joseph Hospital Dialysis Center.

The need is growing rapidly.

Increased support for Val's Fund will help ensure that our patients have access to the best dialysis care in the area, and that we can meet these growing needs of our community. Over the years, the St. Joseph Hospital Dialysis Center has become a neighbor that people in Orange County can count on with confidence.

Val's Fund was begun by a grateful family in memory of their daughter, who worked hard to provide hope and care for others. Now, more than ever, the need is urgent for Val's Fund to assist those who have no other hope. Jim Hawkins, incoming Foundation Board Chair of the St. Joseph Hospital Foundation, has a family tradition of supporting St. Joseph Hospital. His father, orthopedic surgeon G.W. (Bill) Hawkins, served as Chief of Staff at the hospital in the late sixties.

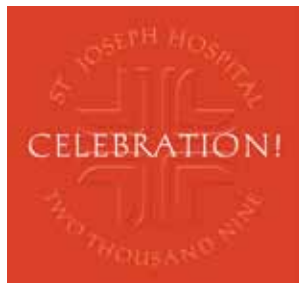

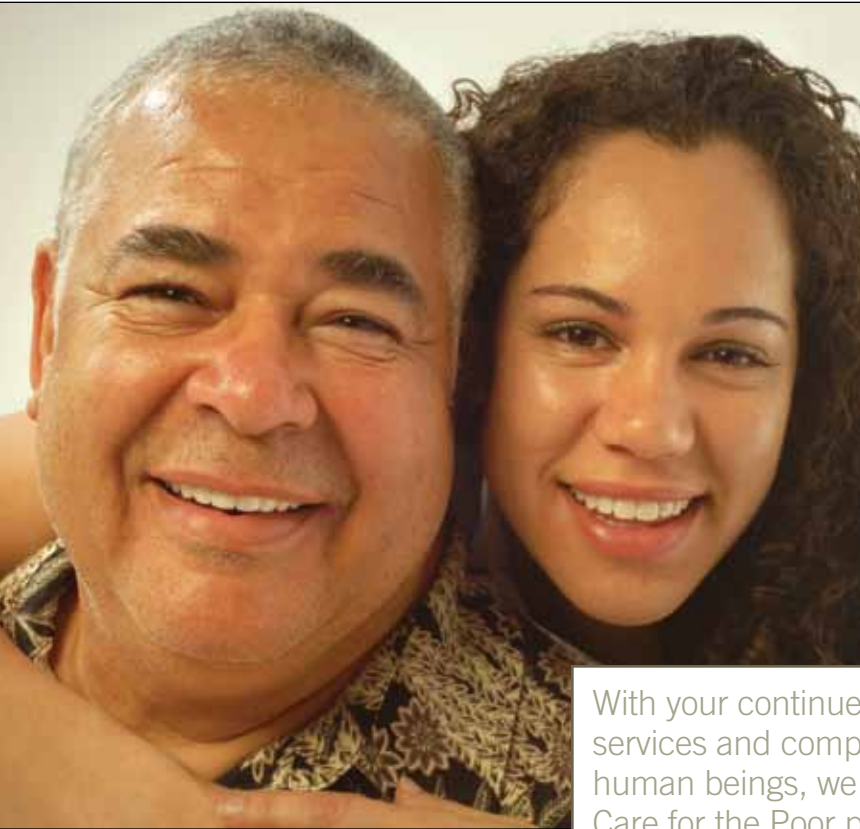

CARE FOR THE POOR | Dollars

Those who have lived with diabetes understand the havoc it can wreak on individuals as well as whole families. Many times patients are not even aware that they have diabetes. When diabetes is suspected a test called A1C is ordered to measure the glucose – or blood sugar levels – of a patient. When glucose is chronically elevated it can lead to progressive damage to the body organs like the kidneys, cardiovascular and heart disease, high blood pressure, vision loss and potential blindness, and

nerves among other disorders.

A St. Joseph Hospital Community Clinic patient, Diego, came to the clinic with a shocking A1C score of 16% – a score higher than many doctors have ever seen. A nondiabetic person will have an A1C between 4% and 6%. He was referred to our community health educator who enrolled him in our diabetes management classes offered through El Club de Salud which promotes healthy meals and exercise.

Diego learned how to use a glucometer and to self-inject insulin. He attended many El Club activities and worked very hard to make changes in his lifestyle. He was able to lower his A1C level to a healthy and safe 5.7%. Diego is very thankful for the El Club program. He says he “is a new man”. He feels more productive at work and has renewed energy. He is happy to be healthy and his wife and daughter are also thankful for his improved health.

As a working man whose employer offered no insurance, without the community clinics Diego might not have learned about his diabetes
