Since patients and families don't always fully understand their disease processes, it is vitally important to paint an accurate picture in understandable terms, especially at end of life. Patient age, ethnicity, and religious preferences must be taken into account. Patients of Hispanic and Vietnamese decent for example are quite common at our facility and require an appreciation of their cultural beliefs to help accurately paint that picture.</p>
